We had the good fortune of being contacted by Mrs. Mary Martin whose uncle was Russell Heagy. Mr. Heagy owned the peanut roaster pictured and every Friday he would roast peanuts and on Saturday morning some of the youth in the town of Manheim would deliver the bags to customers. We just learned that the price for three stuffed-full bags of peanuts was \$1.00.



Some of our readers will also remember the type of valentines pictured in the next column. The 8" x 11" valentines were popular during the late 1930s and throughout the 1940s. HMPF received a small group that belonged to Elias Kready. They were from Kready's Store, sold during more carefree and fun times. The card with them indicates that the price was 2 for 1¢. They were donated to HMPF in remembrance of Kready's Store. The Brick House Cafe at 60 North Main Street is where Kready's Store had been located.









Miles Keiffer's Workbooks
